First anniversary of Let's Read Library celebrated at Oman Avenues Mall

The open-to-public library covers a substantial area on the third floor of Oman Avenues Mall. The area is covered with bookshelves, children's play area, colourful slides as props, comfortable seating areas, educational toys and a bus-themed bookshop to signify and promote the mobile bus libraries that Dar Al Atta'a runs across Oman to reach out to children who do not have access to libraries.

The books on display are available for purchase at a subsidised rate, and the resulting sale proceeds would be reinvested into the development and management of the project. Children are welcome to donate their own books to the Let's Read bookshop at the deposit boxes put up at key points in the mall, and inside the library too.

The Dar Al Atta'a Let's Read programme, started in February 2007 in Oman, has been promoting reading and achieving its objectives by selling books, opening libraries, holding book drives, readathons and writing competitions. Maktabati, mobile library under the programme, visits schools throughout the country.
